CABRILLO BUS SCHEDULE 2021-2022

Transportation for regular education students is limited to those students who live at least two miles from Cabrillo and in the Cabrillo boundry. Addresses are verified through the district's Student Information System. School bus stops can be viewed one week before school starts on the Cabrillo website and district's web page at <u>www.venturausd.org/transportation</u>.



Once the school has issued student identification cards, students will be required to show their student identification card to enter the bus. If your child is not on the list and does not have a student identification card, your child will be denied transportation. *The school office must have a phone number where a parent (or other responsible party) can be reached during the school day.

*Please include your email address when filling out the card

*Only those adults listed on the emergency card may pick up the student from the Health Office.

*In the event of an illness or injury, the school health office is only authorized to communicate with those adults who are specifically noted on the EMERGENCY CARD

Students who live in two households should coordinate information with both parents

Message from the Health Office...

Your personal health safety and the safety of the Cabrillo Middle School community is of the utmost importance. Here are some reminders:

- Parents, please monitor your child's health before they leave home. Fill out the daily health screening in Parent Square. If your student is exhibiting COVID symptoms, please do NOT send them to school.
- Parents, if your student is absent, remember to call the attendance line to report this absence. Depending on the reason for the absence, a period of guarantine or isolation may be necessary. Please plan for this.
- If you are called by health staff because your student is exhibiting symptoms, please be prepared to pick your student up within 15 min.
- Please ensure that your face covering is appropriate. Surgical masks and 2-layer cloth face coverings are allowed. Neck gaiters and masks with valves or filters and single layered cloth masks are not permissible. Students, please keep your mouth AND NOSE covered while indoors throughout the school day. When student's are eating, drinking or outside, facemasks are not required at this time. Please maintain appropriate social distancing from others while unmasked. Please note that these instructions are subject to change from direction of Public Health.
- ALL 7TH GRADE STUDENTS MUST HAVE TDAP BOOSTER AND 2ND VARICELLA DOSE TO ATTEND SCHOOL IN THE FALL. If you have not provided proof of these immunizations, you will be called to pick up vour student.

The pandemic is not over, so please do your part to keep yourself and those around you as safe as you can. We are all in this together.

Accidents Happen...



If your student's injury requires any use of crutches, a cast, splint, a brace, a wrap or any form of medical equipment, a doctor's note and/or a readmission form must accompany the student prior to their returning to school. This is for your student's safety and so that accommodations may be made for them while at school.

Any student requiring medication (prescribed or over-the-counter) during school hours must have a **medication** authorization form completed by the student's parent and physician. All medications are held in the health office and administered by the health office staff. For your child's health and the health of others, please do not send students with medications to self-administer without staff supervision or knowledge. This includes, but is not limited to, pills, ointments, and drops.

Become a VUSD Special Education District Advisory Committee (SEDAC) Representative

SEDAC is a committee of parents representing each school in the district. Parents connect with other parents through the site administrator to help bring parent and student voices to the table as we work together for our students with Individualized Education Plans (IEPs). How Do Parents & Staff Communicate at Cabrillo?

Once your child is in middle school, it is difficult to know how to get the answers to the many questions that you might have. Here is a communication guide available to you at Cabrillo.

WEBSITE: The Cabrillo website contains a lot of information about Cabrillo as well as copies of newsletters, bulletins, a calendar of events, and much more. You will be well-informed by visiting our website.

BULLETIN: A bulletin is read to students at the beginning of every week. These bulletins are also posted on the front page of our website. Check them for timely announcements on campus.

STUDENT PLANNER:

Every student is given a planner provided by the PTO and ASB. The cost to replace a planner is \$5.00. The first pages are a handbook containing the school rules and procedures. This organizational tool gives your child a place to record assignments, homework, and important events. It should be used in all courses (language arts, social studies, math, and science). We recommend parents check the planner nightly to help your child stay on task. If you find that your child is not accessing or using their daily planner effectively, please contact their school counselor for strategies or recommendations.

TEACHER SYLLABUS: Teachers give a syllabus to students in every describing class class the curriculum, standards, and grading systems. These offer pertinent information about the classes in which your child is enrolled.

TELEPHONE: Our number is 805-641-5155. Office staff will either answer your question or send you to someone who can. Our clerical staff is extremely knowledgeable and will connect you with the most appropriate staff member to help you with your question.

VOICE MAIL: Every staff member has telephone voice mail. Call the school and use the name directory to go directly to someone's voice mail. If you have questions regarding your child's grades, progress or report cards, or assignments, call the teacher. They are the best person to answer those questions.

E-MAIL Everyone on staff has email. In most cases, it is the person's first name followed by a dot, and their last name, followed by "@venturausd.org."

For example, the Principal's email is lorelle.dawes@venturausd.org. Most teachers include email addresses on syllabi, and the staff directory on the school website can also be used to locate email addresses.

PARENT CONNECT

O Parent Connect is a



great way to keep track of your child's progress. It is an

online tool or app for your phone that allows you to see your child's grades and assignments (teachers use the Q Grade Book so you will access to immediate have information about your child's grades). Class news can give information about current work as it is assigned.



PARENTSOUARE:

This phone/email/text



system allows the school to contact every Cabrillo family quickly. If we have an emergency at school,

we will use ParentSquare to keep updated. Periodically, families district and site administrators send out voice, text, and /or email messages to families. As a site, we try not to send messages too often, but we want you to be informed.

REMIND: Our PTO uses Remind text messaging system for parents to receive information about Parent Teacher Organization (PTO) events. Text @cms-pto to 81010 to join. Some teachers also use Remind to keep parents informed.

BE AN OBSERVER ON CANVAS:

Cabrillo students may access some of their classes on a platform called Canvas this year. Parents are able to view their child's classwork and assignments by creating their own "observer" account.

Cabrillo Netiquette Tips

Netiquette combines the word <u>Internet</u> and <u>etiquette</u> and refers to a set of guidelines that help students communicate with their teacher and classmates in a positive and productive manner online. Here are some tips from the Cabrillo faculty to be successful with remote learning.

ALWAYS

- Find a quiet place to work.
- Keep an open line of communication with your teacher.
- Dress appropriately for school.
- Treat others the way you want to be treated.

EMAIL

- Use academic, formal writing when sending an email.
- Always include a subject line, greeting and closing.
- Follow all rules of grammar and capitalization.
- Be mindful of your tone when communicating online. Without our voice, the email might take on a different tone than what was intended.
- Click the email icon to the left for more help with proper email format.
- Realistically, there will be tech issues along the way this year. <u>When they occur, remain calm and do the best you</u> can.
- If a student or teacher loses connection, try to reconnect immediately. Classes should give teachers at least 5 minutes to work the issue out before leaving.
- If either the teacher or student is unable to reconnect, student should work on Canvas (if possible).
- In class, if you need help with technology, ask for help in the chat first (we will have a classmate designated to help).



We are all facing unprecedented challenges this year. Let's remember this is a new way of learning for everyone- students, teachers, and parents. Let's all try to be just a little more patient, throw in some random acts of kindness and, again, treat everyone the way you would appreciate being treated. Let's have a great school year!



Textbooks are expensive. PLEASE discuss with your child that students are responsible for taking care of their books while in use from August to June. Keep them away from little brothers, sisters, pets, liquids, and food in backpacks. We must charge for broken corners, mold and mildew from the rain or water bottles, any writing inside, and damage to the cover and binding.

Go through each page of the textbooks to erase any marks and wipe the cover with a disinfecting wipe on the first day the students bring the books home. If you notice any damage to the book, please inform me immediately and bring the book to the library so I can note it in our records. **If textbooks are found to have existing damage, you must inform Mr. Tzipori by email or phone within 7 days of checkout**. Beyond this ONE WEEK grace period, students are responsible for loss and damage of materials, beyond expected wear and tear, up to the district cost for replacement.

Library books are also expensive. An average library book costs \$16-\$24 and takes time and money to catalog and process. Save your child from the agony of receiving an "obligation form" by helping students return books on time and in good condition.

Please remember that your child is responsible for all schoolbooks if a book is loaned to a friend, the *loaner* is responsible for any damage to the book or if the friend loses the book. **Record your barcode numbers** in your planner (or take a photo on your phone). Make sure it is the SCHOOL barcode.

ATTENDANCE POLICY

Regular attendance is essential to success in school. A student not only misses instruction and class work on the day of absence, but also is not prepared for the next day's instruction and assignments. Being punctual and maintaining regular attendance is expected of all students.

Student responsibility:

- Good attendance is the responsibility of all students.
- Each student must make sure a parent/guardian calls in to excuse their absence.
- Students are responsible for obtaining any work required by their teachers.

Parent/guardian responsibility:

- Notify the Attendance Clerk by telephone each day of absence within 72 hours of the absence.
- Call 805-641-5155 ext. 1001 (24 hours a day)
- Provide a doctor's note for all medical/dental appointments.
- Request homework through the office after the third consecutive day of absence.
- Notify the health and attendance office of any chronic health concerns.
- Notify the office of change of address and provide two proofs of residency immediately.

California Education Code 48260 states: Students shall be classified as truant if absent from school without a valid excuse three full days in one school year, or tardy or absent for more than any 30-minute period during the school day without a valid excuse on three occasions in one school year, or any combination thereof.

Examples of excused and not excused absences:

What absences are excused?

- Illness
- Quarantine by Health Officer
- Medical or dental appointments with Doctor/Dental Note
- Funeral of immediate family member
- Court appearance
- Religious holiday

What absences are NOT excused?

- Vacations/trips during school time
- Transportation problems
- Medical problems of the parent
- Funeral not immediate family
- Unverified absence
- Truancy
- Tardy

Leaving Campus During the School Day:

Parent/Guardian picking up students must:

Come to the office, **show picture ID**, sign the student out

If another adult is attempting to pick up student, there must be prior written permission by parent or guardian

*To expedite the sign out process for scheduled appointments, please have the student bring a parent signed note to the office before school starts in the morning. Have it state the student's name, the name of pick-up person, and the pick-up time and reason.

*Adults listed on Emergency contact form are for health office pick up only.

Late Policy:

Tardies to School and Class:

Students who are tardy to school must report to the office, sign in, and get a pass to class. When a student's tardiness pattern has become chronic, a truancy notice may be generated.

Electronic Device Use On Campus

CELL PHONES, EXTERNAL SPEAKERS, EARBUDS, HEADPHONES, ETC.

The following are Cabrillo guidelines for all electronic devices on campus:

- All electronic devices, including cell phones, are to be out of sight and not in use once on the Cabrillo campus, even before school starts.
- Cell phones in view in class or on campus will be confiscated.
- Cell phones may be used once the school day is OVER.
- If a student needs to use their electronic device during the school day, they simply ask an adult and they are allowed to do so in the presence of the adult.

Electronic devices that are confiscated will be returned to the student on the first offense at the end of the school day; on second offenses and beyond a parent or guardian must pick up the device from an administrator.

Electronic devices are brought to school at the students' own risk. Students should keep electronic devices in a secure location at all times.

Students are not to use their phones to call or text parents to be picked up during the day. If a student is sick and feels the need to go home, they must check in to the health office and be released by the health technician or school nurse.




